



WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT FROM OUR PHOTOGRAPHERS THIS SUMMER

A picture is worth a thousand words. We know that sending your child to camp is exciting and scary, and we know that camp photos are your window into the magical moments of your child's camp experience – especially this summer, after more than a year of being together at home.

We do our best to provide coverage of our daily activities in order to share as much of camp with you as possible. This document has been written to let you know how we approach capturing these photos.



Some pictures will have masks on and some won't, depending on a number of factors including: whether kids are in the same pod, how far into a session we are, results of ongoing surveillance testing, and whether programming is inside or outside.

- Our photographers' objective is to best capture the camp experience as a whole. Due to the varying nature of each day at camp, as well as the large number of campers engaged in our daily activities, we cannot guarantee that your camper will appear in photos every day.
- We will take bunk photos during the first few days of each session so you will be guaranteed a photo of your camper with their counselors and bunkmates.
- Our team will sort, label by eidah (unit) whenever possible, and upload photos to CampInTouch once per day. If, due to technical issues or inclement weather, we will not be able to upload photos on a particular day, we'll let you know via social media.
- A handful of photos will be uploaded onto social media each day.

A FEW THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND AS YOU LOOK FOR PHOTOS OF YOUR CAMPER

- Don't worry if your camper isn't smiling in one picture. Sometimes we catch a transitional moment as campers move from talking to their friends, to moving to their next activity. Just because your child isn't smiling in a photo does not mean your child is unhappy or upset. If your child is upset or unhappy over an extended period of time, you'll hear from us.
- Some campers jump in front of the camera and some run and hide from it. We will not force campers to be photographed if they do not want to be.
- Fewer photos are uploaded on bad weather days. When weather restricts people from moving around, our photographers may not capture everything happening across camp.
